Course Overview

Introduction

The Motorcycle Licence Assessment is the final mandatory test to be undertaken to gain your motorcycle licence in Australia.

To be eligible to undertake the licence assessment you must have held an Australian Motorcycle Learner Permit for at least 3 months and complete the Check Ride at least one month prior to the Licence assessment.

During the licence assessment, you will undertake on and off-road assessments one-on-one with a trainer including the eyesight test, hazard perception test (not required if you already hold a drivers licence) and a practical assessment of your motorcycle skills.

This test includes:

On and off-road assessments one-on-one with a trainer including:

On-range, off road assessments:

- warm up ride, curves and change path
- braking from a point
- controlled stop, left turn and slow ride

On-road assessments:

- move off from a parked position on the side of the road
- approach a turn and accelerate to a safe speed after turning
- turn left at a cross or T intersection
- come to a complete stop at a stop sign before proceeding when safe to do so
- slow down and give way at a giveaway sign before proceeding when safe to do so
- ride through a roundabout
- ride through a curve
- ride in traffic

Course Requirements

Entrance requirements & pre-requisites

To book your motorcycle licence assessment, you must:

- have an Australian motorcycle learner permit for at least three months or have held a motorcycle licence issued in Australia, New Zealand or another country within the last five years.
- have successfully completed motorcycle check ride at least on month before the date of your licence assessment.
- provide your motorcycle learner permit.
- be medically fit to drive (if medical conditions need to be assessed by VicRoads, please allow 10 business days from submission of your VicRoads Medical Form to South West TAFE, before your Motorcycle Licence Assessment date).
- be at least 18 years of age.
- be a Victorian resident.
- you must ride a registered and Learner Approved Motorcycle Scheme (LAMS) bike during the assessment (bike hire available).

For this course, you will need to:

Wear appropriate protective clothing including:

- long sleeves and long pants (no exposed skin)
- a certified approved motorcycle helmet
- eye protection while riding (either helmet visor down or protective eyewear)
- a high visibility (hi-vis) vest or jacket (supplied by SWTAFE for training use)
- motorcycle gloves (secured at the wrists)
- sturdy footwear with fully enclosed toes (no thongs, sandals, slippers, etc.)
- wet weather rainwear (if necessary)

Bring with you to show the trainer:

- Motorcycle Learner Permit
- Original VicRoads Check Ride receipt (mandatory for Motorcycle Learner Permits issued in Victoria after 2 April 2016)
